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Inlandsbanan – history & facts:

- The original distance of the railway, from Kristinehamn to Gällivare, is 1,296 km.
- Construction of the railway took approx. 30 years.
- The railway was completed in 1937, when the teams laying the track from either end met up in Kåbdalis. A big party was held on 6 August 1937 for the two teams of navvies, one building the track from the north and the other from the south.
- The railway includes one tunnel and 192 bridges.
- Travelling the full distance onboard one of our trains takes at least two days one way.
- Inlandsbanan runs through seven different provinces: Värmland, Dalarna, Härjedalen, Hälsingland, Jämtland, Ångermanland and Lapland.
- Inlandsbanan makes up 10% of Sweden's railway network.
- The railway bridge over the Pakkojokk river between Jokkmokk and Porjus is considered to be the most scenic bridge along the railway. It is built entirely from natural stone and was completed in 1925.
- Inlandsbanan AB's head office is located in Östersund, in the train depot, and it has offices in Sveg, Hoting and Storuman.
- Inlandsbanan started offering rail holidays in June 1993.
- Inlandsbanan is not electrified.

All roads lead to Inlandsbanan



Train: It is easy to travel to Inlandsbanan by train from most places in southern and central Sweden.

From Stockholm you can also travel by train to Östersund or by the overnight train to Gällivare. A rail service between Gothenburg and Kristinehamn will operate from 29 June.



Car: If you travel to Inlandsbanan by car, most major stations offer long-term parking. Ask the local tourist information centre. But the railway is long and there are several other stops where you can get on and off during the trip. Travel smart and preferably using public transport, and together we can help look after the environment.



Air: If you want to start your journey further north, air travel is an option. There are airports in Östersund, Vilhelmina, Storuman, Arvidsjaur, Gällivare and Kiruna.



Onboard the train, our dedicated train hosts are ready to assist you. They help you find your seat, take your food and coffee break orders and try to deal with all practical problems.

The train hosts are knowledgeable and provide a commentary on the places, sights and natural landscape along the railway. They do not accompany you to your accommodation or on excursions but are always available onboard the train.



Inlandsbanan gems

– from the North to the South

- 1 Gällivare – Dundret.** Dundret fell is located just three kilometres from the centre of Gällivare. The view from the fell is fantastic and you can see 1/11 of the area of Sweden from the top, including the Sarek mountains and Kebnekaise mountain. It is the best place to see the Midnight Sun, between approx. 4 June – 9 July every year.
- 2 Jokkmokk – Ájtte Swedish Mountain and Sami Museum.** Ájtte is the foremost museum of Sami culture, a specialist museum for the flora and culture of the mountain range and an information centre for tourists.
- 3 Arjeplog.** There is much to see and do here, including Gal-tispuoda mountain with its fantastic natural landscape, and the Silver Museum by the square in the centre of Arjeplog, which is a knowledge portal providing information about the Arctic landscape, its people and history.
- 4 Arvidsjaur – Lappstaden.** The Lappstaden settlement in Arvidsjaur dates back to the 1600s and is a well-preserved Sami church town. It is one of the conservation areas in Norrbotten.
- 5 Sorsele.** In addition to the “major” rivers, Vindelälven and Laisälven, there are many smaller rivers here that are seldom visited but which can offer unforgettable fishing. Olsbäcken, Gargån, Giertsbäcken – what these three hidden gems have in common is that they often offer the best fishing in the first half of the season.
- 6 Storuman – Stensele Church.** Stensele Church, known as the “Cathedral of Lappmarken”, is one of Sweden’s largest wooden churches, with space for 2,000 people. Here you will find one of the best preserved copies of Queen Kristina’s bible and – if you look very carefully – the world’s perhaps smallest bible (measuring a quarter of the size of a stamp).
- 7 Vilhelmina – Church Town.** The picturesque Church Town area is home to a youth hostel as well as a local heritage museum, handicrafts building, Sami gallery, art gallery and farmshop.
- 8 Dorotea – Sweden’s only caravan museum.** If you want to experience something a little different, you must visit the Caravan Museum in the centre of Dorotea by the European route 45, opposite the SoliferPolar caravan factory. Here you can learn about the evolution of caravans over the decades.
- 9 Hoting – Ivars Bilmuseum.** This motor museum houses one of the most distinguished collections of vintage cars in Europe.
- 10 Östersund – Jamtli.** A museum unlike any other! Jamtli comprises a museum building with exhibitions and an open air museum with historic farm buildings where actors bring history to life. It also houses the first permanent branch of National-museum in Stockholm.
- 11 Svenstavik – Storsjö Monster Centre.** If you are interested in finding out more about the Lake Storsjö Monster then the interactive Lake Storsjö Centre in Svenstavik is the right place for you.
- 12 Fågelsjö – Gammelgården Bortom Åa.** Part of the Decorated Farmhouses of Hälsingeland UNESCO World Heritage. In 1910 the owners left their old farmhouse and moved into a new building with modern furniture, leaving everything they owned behind in the old house.
- 13 Orsa.** A visit to Orsa Bear Park is a must but you will also find several cycling routes near Orsa. These include the Siljanleden route, which is 310 km long and runs past Lake Orsasjön. Perfect, if you like active holidays and cycling.
- 14 The Swedish mountain range** runs from the Three-Country Cairn in the north to Dalarna in the south and the best thing is that Inlandsbanan covers nearly the same route. If you want a memorable adventure in the mountains, then travel with us and stay at the Swedish Tourist Association’s cabins, hostels and mountain stations for an unforgettable hiking experience.
- 15 Mora – Zorn.** The Zorn museum in Mora is one of Sweden’s most popular art museums. The museum is dedicated to Anders Zorn (1860–1920) and boasts the world’s largest collection of works by the artist.
- 16 Kristinehamn – Picasso statue.** The 15 metre statue is one of the largest Picasso artworks of its kind in the world. There is an exhibition building nearby and guided tours are available during the summer.

Inlandsbanan rail pass holiday



Before this trip we had talked about trying to see more of inland Norrland and the villages and cities in the region. We like to spend our summers travelling in Sweden and enjoy hiking in the mountains. We had thought about making our way to a mountain station and staying in one place, but then we found the Inlandsbanan rail pass. This was perfect for us because we knew our son enjoyed travelling by train. With a young son who won't sit still in his car seat for any length of time, a motoring holiday was not an option. The fact that Inlandsbanan also passes through the places we wanted to visit made it even more perfect.

So I, my husband Edvard and our young son Oscar, aged five months, set out on an adventure with Inlandsbanan this summer.

Because we didn't want to spend too much of each day travelling, we planned the trip in advance to try to limit each train journey to around 4-5 hours, with a few exceptions. One thing we felt was really good was that the train departed at the same time every day so we had exactly 24 hours to explore each location.

We started by taking the train from Örebro to Mora. In Mora, we stayed the night

in the hostel next to the finish line for the Vasaloppet ski race. The following morning, we set out on our 2-week rail pass holiday with Inlandsbanan. I was fortunate enough to spot a bear just north of Orsa on the very first day. That day we covered the entire southern section of the route and pulled into Östersund in the evening. We stayed two nights in Östersund and explored the city. After that, we carried on to Vilhelmina.

From Vilhelmina, we travelled to Saxnäs in the Marsfjällen mountains on one of the buses operating services to the mountains. These buses are included in the Inlandsbanan Card. In Saxnäs we went for a hike in the mountains. The bus back to Vilhelmina departed early in the morning in order to connect to the train travelling north. Oscar enjoyed all the hustle and bustle inside and outside the carriage, and also all our fellow travellers, who stopped by to say hello from time to time. It was also an advantage to be able to walk around the carriage when he became restless. The rocking movement of the train helped him to sleep when he got tired and there was enough space between the table and seat to be able to breastfeed with some privacy. After Vilhelmina, the journey took us to Arvidsjaur, where we stayed for a day before the final stretch up to Gällivare.

Once we got to Gällivare, we spent the weekend with a friend who was working at



the hospital for the summer. In Gällivare we also took the opportunity to fit in a return trip on the Malmbanan railway, staying the night in Narvik.

It was exciting to see the changing Swedish landscape as we travelled northwards. This makes it well worthwhile to just sit and look out of the window. We also spent a lot of time looking out for animals. We saw moose on every section of the railway, and lots of reindeer. On our southbound journey with Inlandsbanan, the first section took us from Gällivare to Sorsele. Sorsele station and museum was a highlight, but so was the stop at the Arctic Circle. The various stops for food were also fun. The commentary provided by the train hosts throughout the journey was also much appreciated.

The next day, we travelled all the way to Östersund. We then carried on home to Örebro from Östersund on the next day. Having changed trains in Mora, we finally got off the train in Grythyttan, where Oscar's grandparents were waiting to drive us back home.



Tamara's top tips for those of you who want to experience Inlandsbanan

We opted for buying seat reservations for each section of the railway so that we could have a table to keep our things on and also to be close to our luggage and the door for getting on and off the rail car. This was really useful. We were travelling with a buggy and a large backpack and we had no problems finding a place to store them.

Before you book, read up on what there is to see and do at the various stops so that you can plan the perfect holiday for you. The actual train journey is

straightforward. The fact that the train departs at the same time every day makes it easy to plan your next journey. Having a card that is valid for two weeks makes it easy to stop off at many places along the way and to stay a day or two longer in the places that you find particularly appealing. By making use of the free travel on the bus routes into the mountains, it is possible to experience even more of the scenic landscape than you can see from the train.

Boil coffee over an open fire, go fishing, keep an eye out for moose, cycle along forest paths or camp out in a tent under the midnight sun. The Inlandsbanan railway is lined with myriad adventures in glorious scenery. The Inlandsbanan Card gives you to two weeks to explore 1,300 kilometres.

Inland Sweden is home to lots of interesting places and experiences. There is something here for everyone, and the Inlandsbanan Card lets you plan your own adventures. Stay in a hotel or hostel or at one of the many excellent campsites right next to the Inlandsbanan railway or close by.

More and more people are looking for active holidays and are keen to try the nature experiences and physical activities that are available along the railway: hiking in a land without roads in Vindelfjällen, fishing for trout in the rich fishing waters in Sorsele, riding, or paddling a kayak. There are a wide range of things on offer for cyclists, with many destinations along the railway offering great opportunities for off-road and road cycling.

On our website you can find tips, travel inspiration and links to places and destinations along the railway and the activities they have to offer.

Hop on your bike or one of the mountain buses to travel deep into the wilderness

Inlandsbanan has many stations along the railway and if you want to travel even deeper into the great outdoors, we suggest taking your bike along or travelling by bus into the mountains. There are spaces for bikes on the train that can be booked in advance if you want to explore the Swedish interior by yourself and want to be sure you can bring your bike.

We collaborate with Länstrafiken in several of the counties along the railway. This enables holders of the Inlandsbanan Card to also use the card on several bus routes in inland Sweden. Visit our homepage for up-to-date information on the buses on which the card is valid.

Sami cultural heritage in Båtsuoj

Are you interested in Sami culture, reindeer husbandry or shamanism?
If the answer is yes, you must visit Båtsuoj Sami Camp. This is the perfect place to further your understanding of Sami culture.



Båtsuoj is located 17 kilometres outside Slagnäs and this is where Lotta Svensson and her husband live and breathe reindeer husbandry. They work to promote understanding and respect for nature and to preserve the unspoilt, silent landscape. In Båtsuoj Sami Camp they have recreated a Sami dwelling and built up a business that they have been running for 25 years.

As a visitor to the Sami Camp in the summer, you can use the boats free of charge and try your hand at fishing. There is a sauna and jetty for those who want to take a dip in the lake. But you can also find out about daily activities in a Sami camp. For example, you can milk a reindeer, prepare food in the tepee and learn about everything on offer in the forest's natural larder. Guests can find out many things by asking Lotta.

"Some visitors want to find out more about reindeer husbandry and what it involves. Others want to learn about herbs and medicinal plants, as well as shamanism, while some guests prefer to explore the camp by themselves."

Lotta has made sure that visitors to Båtsuoj always feel that they are learning about Sami traditions and the Sami way of life.

"Our approach is to greet each of our visitors and identify what it is that they are looking for so that their experience at the camp and the information they receive about Sami culture is tailored to their specific requirements."

Discover those aspects of Sami culture that you are most interested in, all while enjoying the beautiful scenery and the resident reindeer herd.

BÅTSUOJ FACTS

Båtsuoj Sami Camp is located in Slagnäs on the border between the four municipalities Arjeplog, Arvidsjaur, Sorsele and Malå. It is possible to stay overnight and to help out with many of the daily jobs in a Sami camp.

Inlandsbanan stops at Slagnäs station and if you want to book a visit to Båtsuoj, Lotta and her team will arrange a transfer. A visit to Båtsuoj is included in the Inlandsbanan package tour Taste of Lapland.

Sights along Inlandsbanan

Inland Sweden is a glorious mixture of spectacular scenery, flavourful culinary traditions, historic sites and opportunities for exciting activities. Some sights and experiences are especially closely associated with Inlandsbanan.

The Midnight Sun is visible between 4 June and 9 July north of the Arctic Circle. The further north you are, the longer the midnight sun is visible. For most of the summer you can also enjoy the light summer nights, when it never gets dark.

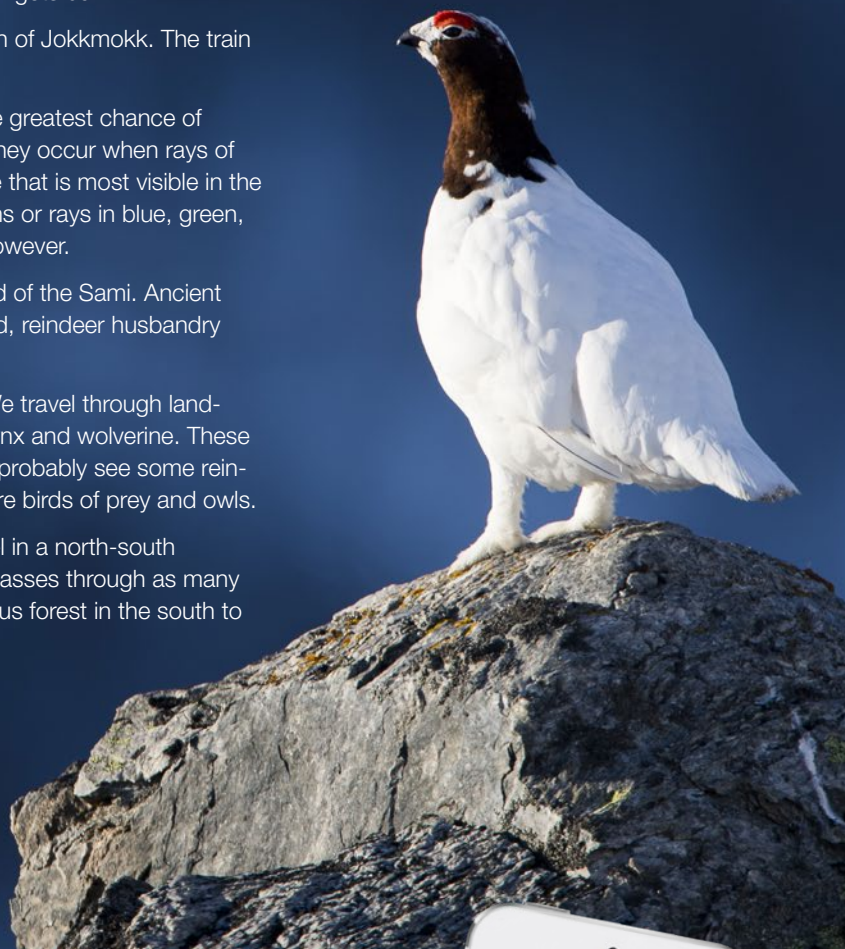
The geographic Arctic Circle crosses the railway just south of Jokkmokk. The train makes a brief stop here.

The Northern Lights are light phenomena that you have the greatest chance of seeing in winter close to either the North or South Pole and they occur when rays of particles from the sun reach our atmosphere. It is a spectacle that is most visible in the darkness of winter, and the display looks like coloured curtains or rays in blue, green, red or purple. The Northern lights are active all year round, however.

The unique Sami culture is alive and well in Sapmi, the land of the Sami. Ancient traditions are being kept alive and can be seen in the art, food, reindeer husbandry and day-to-day life of present-day Sami.

Wild animals are a common sight along the railway track. We travel through landscapes that are home to our four predators: bears, wolves, lynx and wolverine. These are shy animals but it is possible to catch a glimpse. You will probably see some reindeer, maybe even moose, and with a little bit of luck some rare birds of prey and owls.

The varied landscape is particularly evident when you travel in a north-south direction over a distance of 1,300 kilometres. Inlandsbanan passes through as many as 7 vegetation zones and the landscape shifts from deciduous forest in the south to coniferous woodland and bogs in the north.

Useful tips before you travel



ACCESSIBILITY

The railbuses have space for wheelchairs but there may be difficulty embarking and disembarking. The onboard toilets are not accessible. Please contact us when you book your holiday and we will try to find a good solution together. Guide dogs for visually impaired passengers travel free of charge.

ACCOMMODATION

There is a vast choice of accommodation along Inlandsbanan, ranging from hostels to top-class hotels, see inlandsbanan.se for suggestions. For information and bookings, please contact the establishments directly or choose a package holiday that includes accommodation. Remember that it might be a good idea to book in advance at certain times, for instance during the Midsummer weekend and during the month of July, when many people are going on holiday. Advance booking is also recommended when larger events take place, such as the Storsjö Cup football competition in the first week of July and the Storsjöyrans music festival in Östersund during the first weekend in August. Mora is a popular destination, so we suggest always booking your accommodation there in advance, and the same goes for Gällivare. You are responsible for making your own way between your accommodation and Inlandsbanan. Some hotels offer to transfer your luggage.

ACTIVITIES, SIGHTS AND ATTRACTIONS

Most destinations offer cultural activities, outdoor recreation, hiking, museums, sightseeing, restaurants, etc. You can plan and book these activities yourself, or we can do it for you. The local tourist information offices can provide additional, up-to-date tips. See the websites of the respective destinations for up-to-date information. Or visit Inlandsbanan.se and look for inspiration.

BIKES

You can bring your bike along on Inlandsbanan. You should book a space in advance at a cost of SEK 100 for each section of the route. On the Kristinehamn–Mora train, bikes can be brought along if there is space, and on this stretch the cost is SEK 60, payable in cash at the time of travel.

FOOD AND COFFEE BREAKS

We only sell coffee and a small assortment of snacks on the train, which is why the train stops for meals and coffee breaks along the way. The train host takes your orders from a menu available on the train. You can then enjoy your food in the restaurant or café or bring it with you to eat on the train.

KRISTINEHAMN TRAIN

Tågåkeriet i Bergslagen AB (Tågab) operates the service between Kristinehamn–Mora. This service uses an ordinary train pulled by a locomotive and no guiding or food stops are offered on this route. Note the shorter time period (see timetable), and that this train runs all the way to/from Gothenburg.

LUGGAGE

You take care of your own luggage during the journey. We recommend travelling light, ideally choosing a small, wheeled bag or backpack. There is limited space for luggage on the trains.

PARKING

Please contact the local tourist information offices for information on car parking at the railway stations along Inlandsbanan.

PETS

Pets are welcome onboard if they stay on the floor by seats 37-60. Let us know when you make your booking and we'll make sure you both have a place.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS AND SEASONAL ACTIVITIES

Opening hours for activities and attractions are largely planned around the period when most Swedes take their summer holidays, between the end of June and early August. Please contact the respective destinations for up-to-date information.

RAILCAR

On Inlandsbanan you travel by railbus. Inlandsbanan operates the railbus service between Mora and Gällivare in the daytime. The railbuses are powered by fossil-free fuel.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF TRAVEL/TRAVEL GUARANTEE

We recommend you read the terms and conditions of travel that are included with your booking confirmation. These cover the agreement between the holidaymaker and the tour operator in respect of rights, obligations and liability. See inlandsbanan.se for the full terms and conditions of travel. We have lodged the required travel guarantees with Kammarkollegiet, the Legal, Financial and Administrative Services Agency.

TIMETABLE

An exact timetable will be published later on inlandsbanan.se. A preliminary timetable is available on the back of this travel brochure.

TOUR LEADERS

You act as your own tour leader on most package holidays and make your own way to and from your accommodation and activities using the maps provided with the package tour documentation. The train hosts are on hand to assist you onboard the train.

TRAFFIC INFORMATION

A service is operated on the sections Mora–Östersund–Gällivare between 15 June and 23 August. Between 29 June and 9 August Inlandsbanan and Tågab collaborate on operating a train service between Kristinehamn and Mora. For more information, see the respective timetables at inlandsbanan.se

TRAIN HOSTS & GUIDING

Our train hosts onboard the train handle tickets and food and coffee orders. They provide information on the scenery, attractions and activities. They are happy to answer your questions and help make your trip a memorable experience. You can also download the Storyspot app and receive information about the trip in Swedish, German and English.

TRAVEL CONNECTIONS

Try to leave plenty of time when booking connecting travel to and from Inlandsbanan. Trains and buses tend to run on time but delays can occur. We are happy to provide suggestions and to book connecting trains for a booking fee.

TRAVEL TO INLANDSBANAN

All roads lead to Inlandsbanan. From Stockholm you can easily travel by train to Kristinehamn, Mora and Östersund, and there is a night train to Gällivare. From 29 June, you can take the train to Kristinehamn from Gothenburg and you can also return by train to Gothenburg. You can also reach Inlandsbanan by car or air. See page 4 for more information.
